DID YOU KNOW?????

Awana helps provide the foundation kids need to be rock-solid in their beliefs and living out their faith.

- Over half of all church-going teens abandon their faith after high school and the majority of children from Christian homes leave the church by age 19—BUT, 92.7% of Awana alumni continue to regularly attend church as adults

Dear Parent / Guardian,
We have a new electronic Child Check-in system at Lockport Alliance Church. You and your child will be required to check-in where you’ll both be given a sticker label with a unique number on it. Your must have the sticker to pick up your Child at the end of the evening.



Dress Code: Cubbies, Sparks and T&T: Sneakers needed each week for games. Club assigned vest or shirt once it has been earned and issued.

Handbooks & Uniforms:

- LAC will provide a clubber’s first book and uniform and also when a clubber advances to the next handbook level and/or to the next club (at the start of a new club year).
- Parents are responsible for replacing lost items and purchasing vests/shirts a child has outgrown.
- Clubbers must have their own handbook in order to receive credit for work completed.
- Handbooks are designed to be completed one handbook per year. Those who complete their handbooks early are encouraged to complete the review and/or extra credit portions of their books for the remainder of the club year. Additional handbook resources may be available.

Other:



- **Visitors:** Clubbers are encouraged to bring friends with them to club. Please keep in mind, however, that certain activities must be structured to give each child the time they need with adult leaders in learning from the Bible. We will do our best to keep visitors with their friends, but this may not be guaranteed for the entire club night. Remember—everyone starts and ends the night together and they’ll have lots of fun!
- **5-Count:** this is used to regain the attention of small or large groups.

When the adult leader begins the 5-Count, everyone (children & adults) should stop whatever they’re doing, raise the hand & count, with their fingers only, giving their full attention to the leader.

- **3-Count:** this is used for individual clubber discipline, given one-on-one from a leader to a clubber. Consider 1-count as letting your child know what specific behavior is being unacceptable: 2-count as more urgent warning with a second leader present; 3-count as final warning and parent/guardian notified.
