LAC's Word of the Year for 2019: Intentional

It's been our practice, over the past few years, to choose a word at the beginning of each new year to serve as our Word of the Year. Last year's word was <u>Faithful</u>, which reminded us regularly of how faithful God is to us – and how He asks us to be faithful to Him in return.

A highlight of 2018 was our study on the life of Joseph in the Old Testament. What a great example of Joseph's faithfulness to God, despite a series of heart-breaking setbacks — and what a great example of God's faithfulness to Joseph, reminding us that He is working in our lives all the time, even when we don't know it.

For 2019 we have chosen the word <u>Intentional</u>.

"Intentional" is an adjective (descriptor word) that means, "done with intention or on purpose; intended." In baseball, a "walk" is issued to a batter when the pitcher misses the strike zone four times and throws four balls; an "intentional walk" is issued "on purpose" when the risk of putting the batter on first base is less than the risk of the potential damage that he could do if he were allowed to swing away.

In football, "intentional grounding" is a penalty called against a quarterback when he throws the ball away while he's still in the pocket and is about to be sacked. The quarterback

doesn't "just happen" to throw the ball away – he does it on purpose to try to avoid the sack, and it's a penalty in order to reward good defensive effort.

The idea of being intentional is doing things "on purpose, for a purpose." And most of the good things in life don't "just happen" by accident, do they?

A vibrant spiritual life doesn't "just happen" by accident; we have to be intentional about our daily spiritual habits and practices.

A thriving marriage doesn't "just happen" by accident; both partners have to be intentional about investing consistent energy in spending quality time together, not allowing the children to become the center of their lives, and dealing with conflict in a healthy way.

Strong friendships don't "just happen" by accident; they require being intentional about investing time and communication.

Losing weight and/or becoming more physically fit never "just happens" by accident, either. Nor does improving your golf swing, or



developing strong character, or learning a new skill, or overcoming a weakness, or breaking an addiction, or becoming a thriving church. We have to do things "on purpose" over a period of time. We have to be *intentional*.

We'll be talking a lot more about our new WOTY for 2019 as we move forward in this new year. Until then, be thinking about this: What area(s) of my life do I need to be more intentional about? What new "on purpose, by intention" practices or habits do I need to develop this year? And who can I talk to about helping me be accountable in those things?

Here's to a new year of being more *intentional* in all the important things that matter.



Elders Meeting Highlights

Highlights from the January 21st elders' meeting:

- Dave Rheam was welcomed back to the elder board for a new three-year term.
- The elders reviewed the "wins of the week" for December that were shared at weekly staff meetings. God has been on the move at LAC and it was a good year
- The elders chose the word INTENTIONAL as our church Word of the Year for 2019.
- Todd Richards will take the elder board seat on the Ministry Board for 2019 and Dave Rheam will serve as elder board secretary for 2019.
- The elders began their annual SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) for LAC. The church staff and the Ministry Board will also have opportunity to contribute to this conversation and analysis.
- The elders made adjustments to the church organizational chart (org chart) and clarified the "ministry leader check-in" process necessary to be overseers of LAC's ministries.
- Several items were discussed on the elders' list of "Things That Need to Be Fixed." We are making forward progress in several areas. The elders will be working with the Facilities Team to prioritize projects on our campus in 2019.
- A membership interview with Tom & Becky Lattimer was conducted. The elders were encouraged to hear their story and were happy to welcome them back into membership at LAC.
- In light of a higher-than-expected requirement for our District Operating Budget (DOB) contribution for 2019, the previously-approved budget needed to be adjusted slightly as a result. The elders approved a final budget for 2019 of \$400,272, an increase of 4.5% over the 2018 budget.
- The elders discussed several items of a pastoral care/discipleship nature and spent time in prayer for one another and for numerous needs in the LAC

- family. Several recommendations for help from the church Benevolent Fund were also discussed and acted upon.
- Pastor Alex updated the elders on the current status of the church van with the DMV. Because the van was initially titled as a "bus" rather than a passenger vehicle, Albany has required compliance with new draconian legislation regarding buses and limousines. An appeal has been filed and we are seeking to retitle the van appropriately; until then, the plates have been suspended and the van cannot be used by any groups.
- The elders were informed of the Ministry Board's action to approve a new telephone system for the church

- office. The new system should serve the staff well and also eliminate some frustrations with the current system's lack of customer support.
- Attendance reports: Average Sunday morning worship attendance in December was 258 (high 294, low 189 on December 30); average LIFE Hour attendance in December was 113 (high 120, low 102 on December 30). Average weekly worship attendance for 2018 was 260; average weekly LIFE Hour attendance for 2018 was 94.
- The elders reviewed the upcoming calendar of events for February, March, and April and made changes where necessary.



GriefShare

Each day, someone is dealing with loss - in our community, in our church family, someone very close to you or even YOU. It could be a recent loss or a loss from some time ago that is affecting daily life. Maybe you aren't sure how to deal with or move past those feelings. Or maybe you want to know how to help someone who is experiencing grief. Grief Share can help!

GriefShare is a DVD video series that features top experts on grief recovery subjects and case studies of people who have been through the grief experience. It is also a place where people understand your hurts, emotions, and painful experiences! You'll learn practical information that will help you recover from the pain of grief and loss. The support group sessions include a time to talk about what you've seen on the GriefShare videos and what is going on in your life. And while you have the opportunity to tell your story, there's never pressure for you to do so if you don't feel like it.

The GriefShare program consists of 13 weekly sessions. We hope you will join us for the full program. However, as each session is "self-contained" you are welcome to begin attending the program at any point, or pick and choose those sessions that you find of particular interest or need. You will find encouragement and help whenever vou attend. As Lockport Alliance will be running a new 13-week program each Fall and Spring, you are also welcome to continue attendance at the next scheduled event or join us for any sessions you may have missed or would like to revisit.

To better acquaint you with the program, here is a quick overview of the weekly session topics:

Week One: Is This Normal? - Discover why your grief journey may be harder than you imagined

Week Two: Challenges of Grief -Learn some of the common effects grief has on your mind, body, and spirit

Week Three: The Journey of Grief (Part One) - Learn helpful goals to set on your grief journey Week Four: The Journey of Grief (Part Two) - Why it's important to put effort into your healing

Week Five: Grief and Your Relationships - How the death of a loved one affects your friendships

Week Six: Why? - What God has to say to you about your "why" questions

Week Seven: Guilt and Anger - How to handle grief-related anger

Week Eight: Complicating Factors -How your thinking affects your emotions

Week Nine: Stuck - Discover how to prevent getting stuck in grief

Week Ten: Lessons of Grief (Part One) - Often-overlooked reasons why grief is so painful

Week Eleven: Lessons of Grief (Part


Two) - Who are you now that your loved one is gone

Week Twelve: Heaven - Answers questions about heaven and the afterlife, such as what heaven is like

Week Thirteen: What Do I Live for Now? - Learn why moving forward is a necessity

The next session of GriefShare will begin Tuesday, March 5 and run weekly through May 7. Our group meets in the Conference Room in the Admin Building from 6:30 to 8:00pm.
